Here is an update from Costco regarding ordering Kosher meats in bulk:

- # 12716 Kosher ground beef- 270 lbs minimum
- # 12680 Kosher steak- 135 lbs minimum
- # 12660 Kosher Brisket-234 lbs minimum
- # 10894 Kosher whole chicken-160 lbs minimum
- #45479 Kosher chicken breast-72 lbs minimum

Since prices vary, a quote would be given at the time of order.

Orders are delivered in 3-4 weeks.

As mentioned earlier, other options are being explored.

Currently, one can place a bulk order of Kosher meats carried by Trader Joes which only requires a case. Example, 18 steaks in a case.

Safeway is also looking into expanding its Kosher selections.

This continues to be a fluid situation and I will continue to keep you updated with any new developments.

Since October 7, 2023, when Hamas horrifically attacked the State of Israel, antisemitic behavior across the United States and our state has sharply increased. 
